

The Ultimate ACS Study Guide

Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) provides guidelines for healthcare professionals for all types of cardiac emergencies.



EKG Anatomy



P-Wave = electrical activity in the upper heart chambers; represents contraction of SA node and AV node.

PR Interval = time from ventricular depolarization to ventricular contraction.

QRS Complex = ventricular depolarization; represents contraction of ventricles.

ST Segment = period between end of ventricular contraction and beginning of ventricular relaxation.

T-Wave = relaxation of upper heart.

ECG Rhythms

Ventricular Fibrillation - no organized blood, immediate defibrillation.

Ventricular Tachycardia - ventricular arrhythmia; heart rate 100-250 bpm, immediate cardioversion.

P纈tential &逸搏 (Fibrillation Activity) - fibrillation is fibrillation but activity is fibrillation and immediate CPR.

Atrial Fibrillation - on EKG, if leads are all connected, begin CPR immediately.

Sinus Bradycardia - rate less than 60 bpm, no cause/minute, pharmacological if symptomatic.

1st Degree AV Block - prolonged P-R interval, fibrillarity.

2nd Degree Block Type I - Wenckebach - progressive PR interval lengthening, fibrillarity requires treatment.

2nd Degree Block Type II - Mobitz - ventricular fibrillation, fibrillarity.

3rd Degree Block - fibrillation, SA and AV fibrillarity.


Sinus Tachycardia - increased heart rate of 100-150 beats per minute, no cause/minute, pharmacological if symptomatic.

Supraventricular Tachycardia - increased heart rate of 100-150 beats per minute, no cause/minute, pharmacological if symptomatic.

Monomorphic Ventricular Tachycardia - pharmacological for stable patients, immediate cardioversion.

Polyomorphic Ventricular Tachycardia - cardioversion, then cardioversion and CPR.

Torsades de Pointes - different types of QRS complexes form a spiral pattern on EKG, immediate magnesium.



Electrical Therapy Basics



Defibrillation
Used on automated external defibrillator (AED).

Synchronized Cardioversion
Sync with synchronized cardioversion point.

Transcutaneous Pacing
Treats abnormally slow heart rate.

Airway Management



Adjuncts

- Oropharyngeal (OP) airway - use for unconscious patient with a head injury.
- Nasopharyngeal (NP) airway - use for unconscious patient with a head injury. NEVER USE WITH A HEAD INJURY.

Advanced Airways - recommended method, use with trained provider with endotracheal intubation.

Post-Resuscitation Care



Follow the ABCs:

- Airway - continue ventilation and oxygenation
- Breathing - keep PETCO₂ between 35-40mmHg
- Circulation - use BP to determine perfusion pressure of 90mmHg or more

Acute Coronary Syndromes (ACS)

Unstable Angina

- Unexpected chest pain due to poor blood flow
- Increased pain
- Blood thinners
- Angiogram - open or narrow or blocked artery

ST-segment Elevation MI (STEMI)

- Total blockage of a coronary artery
- Electrical activity during the ST-segment shows ST-segment elevation
- Coronary intervention (PCI) or emergency CABG surgery

Non-ST-segment Elevation MI (NSTEMI)

- Partial blockage of a coronary artery
- ST-segment depressed instead of elevated, no thrombolytic
- Pharmacotherapy, immediate percutaneous coronary intervention
- Coronary artery bypass grafting (CABG) surgery




Stroke Assessment and Treatment

Stroke is a frequent complication after an acute ischemic stroke. If a stroke is suspected, immediately transport to the nearest Stroke Receiving Center.

Cincinnati Prehospital Stroke Scale:

1. Age over 60
2. Arm drift
3. Speech

Code Termination

Consult with medical control before code termination.



- 1. Persistent asystole 25 minutes or longer
- 2. Obvious signs of death, withhold resuscitation efforts
