

# DISTRIBUTIVE PROPERTY

The **distributive property** is a fundamental rule in algebra that describes the relationship between multiplication and addition or subtraction. For three numbers  $a$ ,  $b$ , and  $c$ , the distributive property establishes that:

$$(a \times b) + c = (a \times b) + (a \times c)$$

This property allows for expanding and simplifying algebraic expressions, facilitating calculations and manipulations. It is essential in solving equations and in algebra overall, providing a key tool for working with algebraic terms.
