**The Effects of Graphic Organizers on Third Grade Students' Narrative Writing** Sharine Nguyen,2009 Research question In what ways do graphic organizers along with teacher guided questions affect third grade English Language Learner s performance on Narrative Writing prompts Subquestions How will this improve ELL s organization and focus on narrative prompts How will this affect student s use of sensory details How will this affect student s confidence about themselves as writers How will this affect student s attitudes toward writing Research Activities Context This inquiry took place in a third grade classroom at Lincoln Elementary School The school implemented Response to
