4

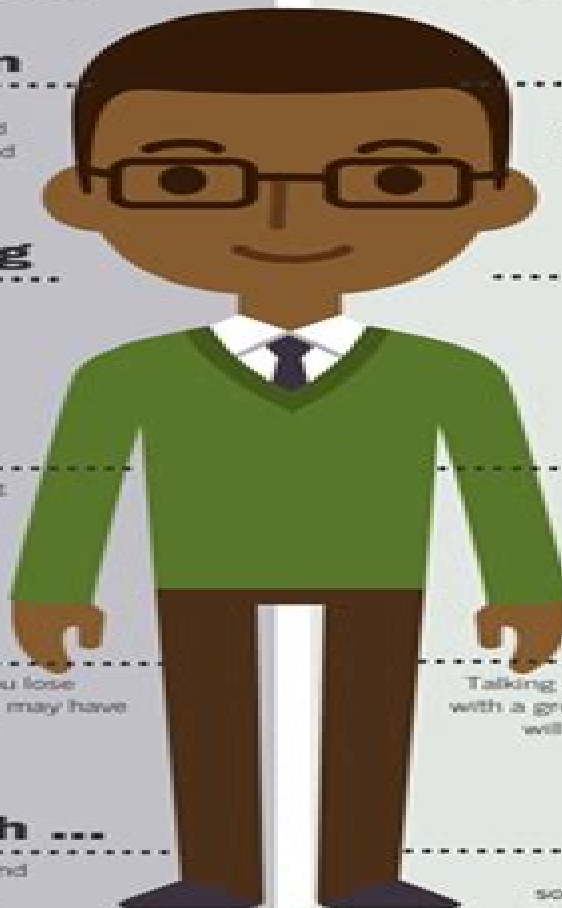
Chatterbox

A Study on Learning Style Preference in Traditional Learning Environment Julius Omonzuanvbo Ihonvbere, Okpeku Timothy, 2024-03-29 Academic Paper from the year 2024 in the subject Pedagogy School System Educational and School Politics language English abstract The study examined learning style preference in a traditional learning environment The specific aim is to determine the influence of individual learning styles on students performance in Technical Drawing Subjects The study adopted a quasi experimental approach to determine learning style preferences in a class of 45 students Learning style inventory was used as an instrument for data collection which was centered on isometric projection The outcome of the treatments was analyzed using Multiple Regression and Pearson Product Moment Correlation Coefficient The findings revealed that kinesthetic learners scored higher in the isometric projection test conducted followed by visual learners and auditory learners came last Hypothetically the result shows a significant difference in the three learning styles visual auditory and kinesthetic However teachers poor understanding of students learning styles seems to be a source of concern to many education experts in Nigeria Hence the study recommends teachers proper understanding and consideration of students visual auditory and kinesthetic learning styles in a traditional learning environment in senior secondary schools in Nigeria
