● *Introduction:*

- Start your essay with an interesting fact, quote, anecdote, or other attention getter.
- Introduce your reader to Anne Frank. Remember that most people already know who she is in general; focus on introducing us to the Anne you got to know (Your perspective).

● *2 body paragraphs:*

- Each paragraph will focus on a different life lesson learned from Anne Frank's story.
 - Begin each paragraph with a topic sentence. (A life lesson I have learned from Anne Frank's story is....)---Feel free to change it up a bit.
 - Each paragraph will have text details to back up the lesson you are writing about. (Be specific, but direct quotes are not necessary)
 - Each paragraph will include your own thinking and explanation that relates the lesson to your life and experiences.

● *Conclusion:*

- You have many options here...
 - Restate Anne's influence on your life (different words)
 - State how Anne's story affects (or should affect) the world.
 - Explain the importance of why Anne's story should never be forgotten.
 - Your own idea could be used instead (depending on the direction your essay went and how you want to wrap it up in the conclusion.)
